Last month, DACA once again became the center of the immigration discussion. On April 24, a federal judge overturned the Trump administration's cancelation of DACA and gave DHS 90 days to offer a better legal explanation for canceling the program. On May 1, Texas and six other states sued the Trump administration for failing to effectively end the program and asked the U.S. District Court to rule on its legality.
